Market Show Rules

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** Exhibitors must meet age requirements set forth in the State Rules. See State Rule VII for age Requirements.
FFA - must attend a school in San Diego County and be a member in good standing with FFA.
4-H - must meet the requirements to be a member of 4-H in San Diego County.
Independent Exhibitors - must attend a school in San Diego County. The Livestock Office may request an official school transcript as proof of eligibility. Youth may be ineligible to participate as Independent if documented disciplinary action involving their project(s) has been taken against them by 4-H, FFA or Grange organizations. Length of ineligibility to be determined by Fair management. Juniors who have been 4-H, FFA or Grange project members within 60 days (120 days for horse and market beef) prior to the Fair are not eligible to compete in that project as Independent juniors or enter project(s) under a different organization. Fair management will also conduct visits to premises where project is kept to verify that the animal is being managed and personally cared for by the Independent exhibitor. **New!** A workbook available from the livestock office must also be completed and submitted by June 1, 2018 to be eligible to show.

2. **NEW! Entry Registration:** Enter online and In-Person to San Diego County Fair, Livestock Department. Entry Forms NOT filled out completely, with ALL required signatures, will not be processed until incomplete information is provided. Supporting documents for online entries are due at time of online submission. All required forms will be accepted in the Livestock Office, during normal office hours, until the deadline. Late entries will NOT be accepted. No badging money will be collected at this time.

3. **OWNERSHIP:** A market animal must be owned, managed and personally cared for by the exhibitor for:
Market Beef 120 consecutive days February 1, 2018120 - day deadline
Swine 60 consecutive days April 2, 2018.....60 - day deadline
Sheep 60 consecutive days
Goats 60 consecutive days
Meat Pens..... 30 consecutive days
Prior to opening day of the Fair for all species, market animals must continue to be owned, managed, and personally cared for by the exhibitor after opening day of the Fair and up to the animal's removal from the Fairgrounds on the designated day/time.
Proof of ownership will be a brand inspection, bill of sale, or signed statement and project record showing animal was bred by exhibitor. Proof of ownership for cattle will be required at the scale.

4. Animals entered in the Breed Show may not be entered in the Market Show. Any violations of this rule will exclude the offending exhibitor from competition in all Livestock Divisions of the Fair.
No substitutions in the Market Show.

5. **PRE-TAGGING:** All animals must be pre-tagged. All clubs/chapters/Independents are responsible for obtaining required tags from the Fair and tagging their own animals according to instructions provided. Any club or chapter needing tagging assistance should notify the Livestock Office at least two weeks in advance of the tagging deadline. All clubs/chapters will be notified as to when the tagging deadline dates will be for all Market animals.

6. **LIMIT OF ENTRIES:** Exhibitors are limited to a total of three market animals. **Large Livestock:** Up to two of each species. Feeder calves are not considered a market entry and will not count against an exhibitor's total number of three Market entries. If the number of animals entered exceeds barn capacity, management will exclude second animal in a species.

7. **Meat Pens:** Only one of each species. Meat pens are considered one animal.

Processing fees are non-refundable except as noted in the State Rules. Fees MUST be received with all entry forms by entry closing date. Submit ONE check for entry fees, camping, jockey quarters and additional parking.

Market Show Rules

- 8. ENTRY FORMS:** Only official San Diego County Fair entry forms will be accepted. Incomplete, incorrect, and/or illegible entry forms will be returned to the exhibitor. Signatures of 4-H Leader or FFA Instructor, and Youth Exhibitor and Parent are required on each entry form. 4-H leaders' signatures will be confirmed by the 4H office (If applicable). Ethics Training Form must be submitted for each exhibitor (see Rule 15).
- 9. INVENTORY SHEET:** A complete inventory sheet must be submitted for each club/chapter or entries will not be accepted. It is strongly recommended that ALL clubs/chapters schedule an appointment to submit their entries and inventory sheets.
- 10. ANIMAL CARE:** All exhibitors are responsible for the care and well-being of their animal(s), including meat pens, until their departure on July 5. Any exhibitor not properly caring for their animal will forfeit sale proceeds.
- 11. WEIGH-IN:** Only **exhibitors**, staff, leaders, and advisors may handle livestock in the weigh-in area. All animals must be given the opportunity to drink prior to stepping on scale. No wet animals will be allowed on the scales. Only exhibitors whose animals did not make market weight may request a re-weigh. Re-weigh must be requested BEFORE the exhibitor leaves the scale area.

- Underweight beef, sheep, swine, and goats will be judged in appropriate feeder classes. Underweight animals are not eligible for the Auction. Market lambs may not carry more than one inch of stretched fleece at any point on their bodies at weigh-in. A Veterinarian and Fair representative will be at the scale to check lambs prior to being weighed.*
- 12. HORNS:** All market animals with horns must be dehorned or disbudded. Scurs may be allowed at the discretion of Fair Management.
- 13. DRUG TESTING:** The staff veterinarian may order a drug test at any time. Each exhibitor must complete and sign a Declaration of Medication Form. Exhibitors agree that the Fair shall be entitled to disqualify any exhibitor whose animal tests positive for any drug. Disqualification results in forfeiture of all prize and sale money. All Champions and Reserve Champions will be drug tested. After Grand Champion Judging, all Champions MUST be presented for tattooing and drug testing that has not been approved by a veterinarian and declared to the Livestock Office. The only individuals allowed in that area will be the exhibitor, leader, one family member, licensed vet and Fair staff. Tattoos will be applied by Fair staff. **SEE LOCAL RULES DRUG TESTING POLICY AT THE BACK OF THIS DOCUMENT.**
- 14. ETHICS TRAINING PROGRAM:** To be eligible to sign an entry form, exhibitors, parents, and leaders **must have** completed the ethics program. New exhibitors, parents, and leaders must receive ethics training prior to showing at the Fair. Contact the Livestock Office for additional information. All Ethics Training Forms must be submitted with entry forms.
- 15. NECK ROPES:** All cattle must be tied with neck ropes by the end of move-in.
- 16. GROOMING:** Animals may be washed in the designated wash rack during designated times only. No grooming products may be used. No alterations may be made to the natural conformation, color, or weight of the animal except to identify the animal by chip, ear notch, or ear tag. Sheep must have legal tail docks. All animals may be slick-sheared and should arrive clean. Only exhibitors will be allowed to groom or handle animals, see National Code of Show Ring Ethics #3. Adults or non-exhibitors found grooming or handling animals risk disqualification of entry, ineligibility for auction and/or dismissal from the Fairgrounds.
- 17. ATTIRE:** Exhibitors must be neatly attired and conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 18. BEDDING:** The bedding used will be shavings, due to recycling requirements.
- 19. BARNs:** Cleaning must be completed by 8am each day. Pens MUST be cleaned daily. Barns will be open to the public 10:00am until 10:00pm. **Manure must be placed in designated areas only.**

Market Show Rules

- 20. VEHICLE ACCESS:** Vehicles will be permitted on the grounds between the hours of midnight and 7:00am. Service Permits must be obtained from the Livestock Office. **Service Permits are for delivery only and not for parking.** Clubs/Chapters will receive one permit per club/chapter. All vehicles must be removed by 7:00am. Passes will be issued to designated leader.
- 21. HOSES:** All hoses must have shut-off nozzles. Hoses must be coiled and out of aisles when not in use.
- 22. UNRULY ANIMALS:** Will be removed at the discretion of the Livestock Coordinator or Assistant Livestock Coordinator at any time.
- 23. ANIMAL ILLNESS:** Any animal showing evidence of illness will be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds. The decision of the staff veterinarian is final. Any and all medication must be reported to the Livestock Office. Prior to treating any animal, veterinarians must report to the Livestock Office.
- 24. SCRAPIE (Sheep & Goats):** Pursuant to USDA, all sheep and goats entering fairs are required to have official Scrapie identification. All out-of-state sheep and goats are required to have official identification, a certificate of veterinarian inspection and California entry permit. See State Rule X, Sheep and Goats Health Rules.
- 25. VET SERVICE:** Exhibitors who fail to pay for veterinarian services rendered by the contracted Fair veterinarian will not be permitted to show until outstanding bills have been settled.
- 26. CHANGES:** Fair Management reserves the right to move animals, if necessary, and to change the scheduled program.
- 27. BADGES:** See Badging Request Forms.
- 28. RELEASE:** An Auction Sales Slip or Non-Auction Slip must be presented at the gate upon exiting. Animals will not be released until the packer trucks have left.
- 29. SECURITY:** The San Diego County Fair does not provide security or guard services and is not responsible for the acts of third parties.
- 30. FANS:** No fans or generators may be brought onto grounds.
- 31. SCALES:** No scales may be brought onto the Fairgrounds. This also includes the small animal barns.
- 32. INSURANCE:** Exhibitor insurance is offered through the state of California. Independent exhibitors must provide their own insurance at the time of entry. Contact the Livestock Office for more information.
- 33. BACKGROUND CHECKS:** All exhibitor-less leaders, advisors or adults in charge must be cleared through criminal and sex offender background checks. Individuals not cleared through 4-H or their school will need to pay a \$20.00 background check fee, complete the paperwork and be cleared before a badge will be issued.
- 34. ALUMNI YEAR EXHIBITORS:** Livestock projects must be personally cared for by the exhibitor. Exhibitors must reside in San Diego County. Projects must be housed within San Diego County. Leader/advisor signature on the entry form serves as proof that the project was personally cared for by the exhibitor in its respective youth agriculture program. **Animal projects raised outside of San Diego County will no longer be permitted entry into the Market Show.**
- 35. BADGES:** All Market Exhibitors and their approved families living on grounds **must** have a photo badge issued by the Fairgrounds. All badging must be completed prior to Friday, June 1. No exceptions.
- 36.** All Youth Exhibitors must be under the supervision of chapters'/clubs leader while on the Fairgrounds.
- 37. VARIANCE:** A variance may be granted to the exhibitor following the death of his or her animal. It is also understood that the new animal is NOT eligible to compete for Champion at any level. The variance form provided by the Livestock Office must be filled out and signed by the exhibitor, parent, and advisor/leader. The following documents are also required to complete the variance:
 1. A death certificate from the veterinarian must be submitted to the Livestock Office.
 2. A copy of the bill of sale for the new animal must be submitted.
 3. A statement from the Leader or Advisor giving the ear tag number, species, and owner of the deceased animal.

Calves may be of dairy or beef breed. Breed determination is to be made at the scale. If there is any question as to the calf's breed, the decision will be made by a committee of three, (Livestock Coordinator, Assistant Coordinator, and a cattle breeder). Proof of ownership (Bill of Sale) will be of sale, or signed statement and project record book showing the animal was dropped from exhibitor's cow and was raised by exhibitor.

Feed may consist of milk/nutritional formulas, grain, and hay.

Castration and dehorning are required. Calves must be born on or after December 1, 2016. Proof of birth date required at weigh-in.

Calves will not sell in the Junior Livestock Auction. The calves will show in a feeder class and will be allowed to return the following year and be shown in the Market Cattle Show. Calves will be split into beef and dairy breeds.

Weigh-In: Exhibitors must bring their animal(s) to be weighed. Animal(s) not brought to scales will be disqualified. See Market Show Schedule for specific weigh-in date and time. Animals not making weight must be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds.

Meat Pen Care: Exhibitors are responsible for care of their meat pens during Market Week, this includes feeding and cleaning. **Meat pen ages are the age of the animals on the first day of the show.**

Hatchery receipt or delivery invoice must be attached to entry form to prove age of the meat pens. Breed must be listed on entry form.

Exhibitors must be in their organization-approved show uniform for any of the meat pen judging. Exhibitors who desire to assist their fellow exhibitors in the show must be in their organization-approved uniform.

Birds not leg banded prior to weigh-in will be disqualified. Bands are not provided by the Fair.

All birds must be inspected prior to being penned.

HOW THE AUCTION WORKS -BUYERS

The auction book will list all of the animals by number in order of sale. The animal's weight, owner and 4-H or FFA affiliation are also listed. This will assist you on deciding which animals you wish to purchase.

As each animal enters the ring, the auctioneer will ask for bids in price per pound. By consulting the auction book, you will have a rough idea (by multiplying the weight by the price per pound) of the price of the animal. If you wish to bid on an animal, raise the card displaying your Buyer Number. If there is anything you don't understand about the bidding, ask one of the ringmen to assist you. The bidding continues until a high bid is reached. GOING ONCE - GOING TWICE - SOLD to the highest bidder.

A runner will bring the sales slip to you. Please sign the sales slip, indicate the disposition of the animal and make sure that all information is filled out completely and legibly. Disposition selection is final on submission of sales slip. Any disposition changes will be charged a change fee of **\$30.00**.

PAYMENT OF PURCHASES

Payment is due at the close of the auction.

Multiple buyers per lot are accepted and each buyer will be responsible for an equal portion of the sale unless otherwise stated. If a distribution other than equal portions is desired, this must be adjusted when the runner brings the sales invoice to the buyer at the time of sale. One bidder must be designated as the "Responsible Buyer" and will be the reference for any disposition information. This should be designated by the buyer on the invoice when delivered by the runner by checking the box to the left of the responsible buyer's name. If no selection is made, the first-listed buyer will be considered the "Responsible Buyer". Check transactions will require a Driver's License. All checks will be verified prior to acceptance. We accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express. All sales are subject to a **5%** processing fee.

The legality of tax deductions for the purchase of auction animals is a matter for consideration by the IRS or your own tax accountants.

DONATION TO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

You may wish to purchase an animal and then donate it to the Scholarship Fund. The original amount you paid for the animal will go to the exhibitor. The amount the animal is resold for will be the amount received by the Scholarship Fund. If you plan to donate an animal, please notify a ringman or the auctioneer immediately by calling out "Donate to Scholarship Fund". You will still be required to fill out a sales invoice.

Animals donated to the Scholarship Fund will be resold in the following manner:

1. At the **end** of the auction, the LOT numbers of all donated animals will be posted on the RESALE BOARD with a PRICE PER POUND.
2. Resale begins after all species are sold. Sale of the resale animals will be held in the Livestock Office on June 30 from the conclusion of the auction until 9pm, and July 1, 10am – 2pm. You may then purchase the animal of your choice, at the Price Per Pound listed. Advise the Livestock Office Staff of the LOT number you wish to purchase, and they will help you fill out the appropriate paperwork. Resale is on a first- come, first-served basis. You may purchase as many animals as you wish.
3. The boards will be located outside the Livestock Office. Remember that all proceeds from these donated resale animals will go to the JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SCHOLARSHIP FUND.

LIVESTOCK AUCTION RULES

1. Only Blue Ribbon Animals are eligible.
2. Each exhibitor will be limited to ONE large animal, with the exception of the exhibitor(s) who have one or more Grand Champions, Reserve Grand Champions, Division Champions, or Division Reserve Champions. All Division Champions must sell. All Grand and Division Champions Meat Pens must sell.
3. A processing fee of 5% of sale price will be charged for each animal sold at the auction. The fee will be deducted from the seller's payment check.
4. Auction participant must agree to waive their "right to reserve bid" and authorize the Fair to sell "without reserve" to the highest bidder.
5. **New! Payment will only be made on beef up to 1400 pounds, Swine up to 290 pounds and Sheep up to 160 pounds. Goats are sold by the head.**
6. Auction animals will be taken through sale only by the exhibitor, unless extenuating circumstances have been approved by the Livestock office.
7. Exhibitors of auction animals will be responsible for the proper care of the animal until it is delivered to the buyer or agent on specified date and time. Packer truck schedule will be announced at a meeting following the awards ceremony. A \$25.00 handling fee will be charged to exhibitor in the event of late or non-delivery of his/her animal. Self-haul animals not removed from Fairgrounds by 6am on July 5, 2018 will become property of the San Diego County Fair.
8. **New!** To participate in the Barn sale; a handling fee of \$35.00 will be charged. Exhibitors found advertising prior to the conclusion of the auction will forfeit the right to barn sale.
9. Your leader can obtain non-auction sale forms from the Livestock Office. The form must be completed and returned to your leader. All forms must be received in the Livestock Office no later than noon on July 4, 2018. The San Diego County Fair is not responsible for payment of barn sale animals. This is a private-party sale.
10. Checks will be mailed a minimum of 30 days after the auction. Any exhibitor who has not received his or her auction check by September 30, 2018, must notify the Exhibit Office at 858-792-4207 no later than October 1, 2018. After October 1 a \$25.00 reissue fee will be deducted from payment. Checks not cashed within 12 months of issue date will be forfeited.

Scratch Sheets will be available in the Livestock Office immediately after judging. **Scratches not submitted by the deadline will be decided by Livestock Management.** Scratch Sheets are to be filled out and signed by the exhibitor AND his/her Leader.

Auction Will Call deadline is Friday, June 29, Noon. Three names maximum per exhibitor.

Non- auction and self-haul animals will not be released until packer trucks have departed.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE)

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally, It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be approved by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

SAN DIEGO COUNTY FAIR DRUG TESTING POLICY

It is the intent of the San Diego County Fair to ensure the quality and integrity of the animals being sold during Junior Market week through a drug testing program.

All class and division champions of each species will be drug tested. All animals in Grand Champion Drive will be retested upon leaving the show ring.

The drug testing program will be administered and supervised by the licensed veterinarian contracted by the San Diego County Fair to oversee animal health issues. The licensed veterinarian, in conjunction with the laboratory conducting the drug tests, will determine the compounds that each sample will be tested for.

These compounds may include, but not limited to: Antibiotics, Local Anesthetics, Non-Steroidal Anti-inflammatory drugs, Diuretics, Sedatives/Tranquilizers, Steroids, and Growth Promoters.

At time of collection, all samples will be divided into two separate containers and marked with the appropriate information. If a positive test result is returned on any sample, the family will have the option of sending the second sample to a testing laboratory (at their expense) to confirm the initial test.

If an animal tests positive for an illegal substance, the following action will be taken:

1. If results are received during the Fair, animal will be removed from competition and exhibitor may not compete in any class at the current Fair.
2. Animal affected will be removed from the food chain. This will require contacting the buyer to notify them that the animal they purchased is not fit for consumption. All money paid by the buyer will be returned to them immediately.
3. The exhibitor will forfeit all monies from the sale of said animal. If the animal or the carcass is available, and the family desires, it will be returned to them.
4. The following year the exhibitor may not compete in any capacity, during the Junior Livestock Market Show.
5. If the exhibitor desires to show the year after suspension all animals entered will be subject to drug testing.
6. If an animal tests positive for anabolic steroids, the exhibitor may not compete at the current or any future San Diego County Fair.



Entry Fee: \$25.00 per head

All market beef, swine, sheep, and goats exhibited during the Market Livestock Show are eligible to enter the ultrasound carcass contest. Exhibitors with multiple market animals may enter all eligible animals.

Contest winners will be selected prior to the conclusion of Market Week; the results will not be announced until the conclusion of the Fair.

Entries will be judged on ultrasound measurements recorded on live animal after weigh-in. Results for this contest will be announced at the conclusion of the Fair.

- ◆ **New! Grandparents may be badged and not count against the 2 adults in charge.**
- ◆ FFA exhibitor-less leaders must provide proof of criminal and sex offender background check or pay a \$20.00 fee and submit one through the Livestock Office prior to being badged.
- ◆ Exhibitor-less leaders are authorized one badge and one parking pass. Leaders must submit this form and be approved by the 4-H office as official leaders.
- ◆ All names must be listed on this form.
- ◆ All other family members wishing to attend the Fair must purchase tickets to enter the Fairgrounds.
- ◆ For families needing more badges than those allowed above, the Fair offers a \$28 season pass that is good all 26 days the Fair is open, June 1 - July 4. This pass is available through the Fairgrounds Box Office now through July 4.

Failure to comply with the following rules will result in removal from the Fairgrounds.

1. Group leader or advisor must submit all Club/Chapter reservations for Market exhibitors.
2. Each reservation must be in the name of the adult responsible for the space. Reservations are limited to exhibitors or parents, leaders, and advisors of exhibitors showing market animals on the dates requested.
3. There will be no admission to the camp area prior to designated arrival time. All camping accommodations will be placed by appointment on or before Sunday, June 24, 2018.
4. Failure to vacate at the designated time will result in vehicles being towed at the owner's expense.
5. The Livestock Coordinator assigns camp spaces. RVs and trailers must be in assigned space. All camp vehicles must be placed in accordance with Fire Marshal Restrictions. Pop-outs may only be extended towards the aisle and on one side of the trailer/RV. All camp vehicles must be approved as overnight stay vehicles and display proper credentials.
6. Non-camping vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas only. Each club/chapter may park **only one** stock trailer in designated dead storage area and display permit issued by the Livestock Office. All others must be removed from the Fairgrounds after delivery of animals. Any vehicle illegally parked is subject to towing.
7. If you pay a camp fee for a stock trailer, you will forfeit the fee and be asked to remove the trailer.
8. Each exhibitor receives one parking permit (One parking pass per family). One additional vehicle permit may be purchased to park in designated areas. Spaces may NOT be reserved to park additional vehicles. **A parking permit does not guarantee a parking space.** Vehicles improperly parked will be towed at owner's expense. Parking permit must be displayed and affixed to windshield in parked vehicle at all times. **No Taping of Permits.**
9. RVs must be self-contained. Water hookups are available. No electrical or sewer hook-ups are available. **No generators. NO dumping of wastewater of any kind on the ground or in drains.** Pump service is available for a nominal charge. Contact the Livestock Office for pumping service.
10. All youth must be under the supervision of an adult at all times.
11. Bicycles, Motorcycles, and Electric/Gas Carts will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds.
12. **Quiet** hours will be observed from 10:00 pm – 6:00 am.
13. All camping fees MUST be received by the entry deadline - Friday, May 4, 2018.
14. **Dogs:** A permit must be obtained from the Livestock Office in order to have dogs in camping area only. You must clean up after your dog.
