BREED SHOW RULES-OPEN & YOUTH

How to Enter

1. Go to <https://www.sdfair.com/p/participate/entry> and click on the Livestock icon under the competitions page and follow the instructions. Use a Visa or MasterCard to pay entry fees.
2. All entries must be registered online, and entry fees paid by 11:59 pm, May 18, 2024.
 - a. Names, addresses, registration number, dam/sire name, ear tag, tattoo or permanent marking, birthdate, etc. on each and every entry form(s) are required by May 24, 2024. Any entry missing all or part of the information required shall result in the disqualification of those entries. The information provided will be used exactly as entered for award recognition and payment of award premiums. Please pay special attention to proper spelling, capitalization, full names of cities/counties, no abbreviations and the correct mailing address.
3. Everyone must register as an exhibitor when logging in for the first time in any given year. If you entered last year, you will still enter as a first-time exhibitor.
4. This Competition Guide is posted in advance and will be subject to any action that may cause revision or curtailment of the sections, premiums or regulations listed
5. Take a moment to look through this Competition Guide to see which competition your entry is eligible to compete in.
6. Note that sessions expire after 20 minutes of inactivity, so “save to cart” if you plan on leaving the computer for more than 20 minutes.
7. Submission of entry implies acceptance of all rules and conditions as stated in this competition guide. Contact the San Diego County Fair Entry Office with any questions concerning entry policies and procedures.

BREED SHOW RULES-OPEN & YOUTH

The Local and State Rules found at

<https://www.sdfair.com/p/participate/entry>, apply to this Department.

ELIGIBILITY: Open Livestock Divisions are open to all United States residents. Youth Division exhibitors must be at least 9 years of age and no more than 19 years of age as of January 1, 2024, in order to show Breed Show livestock (Beef, Llamas, Dairy, Sheep, Goats, and Pygmy Goats). All Exhibitors must meet the State Rules definition of age and eligibility. Classes designated 4-H or FFA are limited to members of those organizations.

1. This Competition Guide is posted in advance and will be subject to any action that may cause revision or curtailment of the sections, premiums or regulations listed.
2. Animals entered in Breeding Divisions may NOT be entered in Market Divisions. Any violations of this rule will exclude the offending exhibitor from competition in all livestock divisions of the Fair. See State Rule VII for other Youth eligibility rules.
3. **ENTRY REGISTRATION DEADLINE:** Online registration ONLY. Entries must be submitted at [sdfair.com/p/participate/competitive-exhibits/](https://www.sdfair.com/p/participate/competitive-exhibits/) by 11:59pm (PDT) on Wednesday, May 18, 2024. Entries will receive e-mail confirmation. No Faxes.
4. **LIMIT OF ENTRIES:** If the number of animals exceeds barn capacity, management will limit entries based on date when entry was received.
5. **PROCESSING FEES:** See specific division. Processing fees are non-refundable except as noted in the State Rules. All monies received with online entries will be immediately deposited.
6. **ONLINE ENTRIES:** Only official San Diego County Fair ONLINE entries will be accepted. Incomplete, incorrect, late and/or illegible online entries will not be accepted.
7. Breeding Animals not identified at least by birthdate and at least one of the following: dam's name and her registration number, ear tag, tattoo or permanent marking or by the registration number prior to the closing date of entries may be made eligible only by paying a penalty of \$10.00 per entry. Only cash or certified cashier's check will be accepted as payment for these penalties
8. **YOUTH EXHIBITOR LEADERS:** All Youth Exhibitors must be under the supervision of Chapter/Club leader while on the Fairgrounds. A complete inventory sheet must be submitted for each club/chapter or entries will not be accepted. Please schedule appointment for clubs with 20 or more entries.
9. **BADGING:** Every exhibitor is required to purchase an exhibitor badge which is valid for the entire run of the 2024 San Diego County Fair, no exceptions. All exhibitors are required to show picture ID to receive Badge. All Breed Show Exhibitors must be badged.
10. **SIGNATURES:** Youth Divisions: Signatures of 4-H or FFA Instructor and youth exhibitor and parent are required on each entry form. Open Divisions: Require signature of exhibitor.
11. **REGISTRATION:** Must be submitted in accordance with State Rules. All registration papers will be checked before show time. Association recording date or transfer date, if indicated on registration papers, will be acceptable in determining length of ownership of registered animals. Original papers only. Photocopies and "Bill of Sale" will not be accepted. Unregistered Purebreds: By his signature as the Owner or Agent on an entry form, the exhibitor certifies that the sire of each animal entered in classes for grade animals was either registered or purebred. A permanent ear tag or tattoo number MUST be written on the entry form. Substitutions must be done at this time. Faxes will be accepted from official registry offices only. Appendix animals will show in AOB Division, unless there are enough Appendix animals to have their own Division.
12. **JUDGING:** The American System will be used, unless otherwise stated. Only authorized personnel will be allowed in the judging ring. The Fair reserves the right to cancel or combine classes in which there are not enough entries. State Rule II-9.
13. **AWARDS:** See specific Division for awards. Two or more exhibitors must show in a division to qualify that division for championship money. Exhibitors are eligible to receive only two cash awards per class. The Fair assumes no responsibility for awards sponsored by clubs, firms or individuals. Premium checks will be issued within 30 days following the close of the Fair.

BREED SHOW RULES-OPEN & YOUTH

14. **PREMIER BREEDER** (Open Divisions Only): An award to be made to the breeder (not to exceed six animals) winning the most money in open individual classes, including animals bred by the breeder, but exhibited by others. This award must also be deemed worthy by the judge. No limit on number exhibited, but award automatically figured on top six animals winning the most money. In case of a tie the breeder winning the most firsts will receive the award. If a tie still exists, the one with the most seconds will win, etc. until the tie is broken.
15. **PREMIER EXHIBITOR** (Open Divisions Only): Award to be made to the exhibitor (owner of animal) not handler. To be determined by the following point system. Individual classes only.

Grand Champion7 pts	1 st Place 3 pts
Reserve Grand Champion....6 pts	2 nd Place 2 pts
Champion5 pts	3 rd Place..... 1 pt
Reserve Champion.....4 pts	
15. **TAX IDENTIFICATION INFORMATION:** The 22nd DAA (San Diego County Fair) is required by the Internal Revenue Service to report any premiums paid totaling \$600 or more. Exhibitors will be required to complete a W-9 form at the time of entry. Place Tax Identification Number and corresponding name on "Issue Check To" line if this information is different from exhibitor name. **A new W-9 is required each year.** For checks to match the W-9, exhibitors must register under their legal name.
16. **ATTIRE:** Exhibitors and their assistants must be neatly attired and conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
17. **BEDDING:** The bedding used will be shavings, due to recycling requirements. Breed Sheep and Angora Goats may bed on straw. First bedding will be provided.
18. **CLEANING OF BARN AREAS:** Stalls, pens, and aisles must be cleaned by 9:00 a.m. each day. Pens **MUST** be cleaned daily. No more than 1" of bedding can be left in the bottom of pens upon departure from the Fair. A cleaning fee of **\$50.00** will be deducted from the exhibitor's premiums for each pen found excessively dirty upon departure. Staff will check pens at departure. Youth exhibitors must clean pens to center aisles on departure date.
19. **FOOD AND DRINK:** Food and/ Drink for human consumption is prohibited in the barn area. Consuming of food and beverage items may only take place outside of the barns.
20. **BARN HOURS:** Barns will be open to the public 11:00am until 9:00pm. The Fair is closed on following days: June 12, 13, 19, 20, 26 and 27.
21. **VEHICLE ACCESS:** Vehicles will be permitted on the grounds between the hours of midnight and 8:00am. Service Permits must be obtained from the Livestock Office. Service Permits are for delivery only and not for parking. Clubs/Chapters will receive one permit per club/chapter. Vehicles left unattended or who are blocking fire lanes and thoroughfares, or who are still on grounds at 8:00am, are subject to tow at owner's expense.
22. **HOSES:** all hoses used in the barns where foot traffic is present and the barns are open must have shut-off nozzles, be rolled, and out of aisles when not in use. Hoses may not be removed.
23. **UNRULY ANIMALS:** Will be removed at the discretion of the Livestock Coordinator or Assistant Coordinator.
24. **NECK ROPES:** All cattle must have neck ropes.
25. **ANIMAL ILLNESS:** Any animal showing evidence of illness will be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds. The decision of the staff veterinarian is final. Any and all medication must be reported to Livestock Office. Prior to treating any animal, veterinarians must report to the Livestock Office.
26. **VET SERVICE:** Exhibitors who fail to pay for veterinarian services performed by the contracted Fair veterinarian will not be permitted to show until outstanding bills have been settled.
27. **SCRAPIE** (Sheep & Goats): Pursuant to USDA, all sheep and goats entering fairs are required to have official scrapie identification. All out-of-state sheep and goats are required to have official identification, a certificate of veterinarian inspection and California entry permit. State Rule X – Sheep and Goats Health Rules.

BREED SHOW RULES-OPEN & YOUTH

- 28. CHANGES:** Fair Management reserves the right to move animals, if necessary, and to change the scheduled program. Show order is subject to change in both the open and youth shows to make the show run more smoothly.
- 29. FEED RELEASE:** Tack and animals will not be permitted to be removed from the Fairgrounds without a release. Release forms must be obtained at the Livestock Office on departure evening and presented at the gate upon exiting.
- 30. SECURITY:** The San Diego County Fair does not provide security or guard services and is not responsible for the acts of third parties. Exhibitors are encouraged to obtain insurance.
- 31. DRUG TESTING:** Exhibitors agree that the Fair shall be entitled to disqualify any exhibitor whose animal tests positive for any drug. Disqualification results in forfeiture of all prize money.
- 32. UNAUTHORIZED ANIMAL REMOVAL:** Exhibitors found removing animal(s) prior to the Fair's departure schedule without Livestock Office permission shall forfeit all premiums and be excluded from entering future Fairs.
- 31. CONTACT INFORMATION:** If you have a change of address, phone number or email address, you are required to update this information with the Entry Office so we can contact you regarding awards.

BREED SHOWS - RV's, TRAILERS, BADGING & OTHER FEES

Forms and fees must be submitted with online entries on or before Wednesday May 18, 2024.

Requests received after the deadline will not be eligible for accommodations.

FEES LISTED BELOW

Camping Space \$100.00 - Limit (1) Per Exhibitor

Septic Pumping - \$20.00 fee per pumping - No Limit

Jockey Quarters Fee \$80.00 – Limited to exhibitor and 2 badged family members

Extra parking space \$ 55.00 - Limit (1) Per Exhibitor

Exhibitor Badge \$25.00 (required for each exhibitor)

Additional Badging \$25.00 Limit (3) Per Exhibitor

Failure to comply with the following rules will result in removal from the Fairgrounds.

1. Every exhibitor is required to purchase an exhibitor badge which is valid for the entire run of the 2024 San Diego County Fair, no exceptions.
2. Tents will require a camping space, fee is \$100.00.
3. Each reservation must be done online with the exhibitor's livestock entries. Only one space will be available per family. Reservations are limited to exhibitors or parents, leaders, and advisors of exhibitors showing market animals on the dates requested.
4. There will be no admission to the camp area prior to designated arrival time. All camping accommodations will be placed by appointment on or before Sunday, June 18, 2024.
5. Failure to vacate at the designated time will result in vehicles being towed at the owner's expense.
6. The Livestock Coordinator assigns camp spaces. RVs and trailers must be in assigned space. All camp vehicles must be placed in accordance with Fire Marshal Restrictions.
7. Pop-outs may only be extended towards the aisle and on one side of the trailer/RV. All camp vehicles must be approved as overnight stay vehicles and display proper credentials.
8. Non-camping vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas only. Each club/chapter may park only one stock trailer in designated dead storage area and display permit issued by the Livestock Office. All others must be removed from the Fairgrounds after delivery of animals. Any vehicle illegally parked is subject to towing.
9. If you pay a camp fee for a stock trailer, you will forfeit the fee and be asked to remove the trailer.
10. Each exhibitor receives one parking permit. One additional vehicle permit may be purchased to park in designated areas per family. Spaces may NOT be reserved to park additional vehicles. A parking permit does not guarantee a parking space. Vehicles improperly parked will be towed at owner's expense. Parking permit must be displayed and affixed to windshield in parked vehicle at all times. No Taping of Permits.
11. Extra Parking Credentials does not guarantee a spot for vehicle.
12. Each family is allowed to purchase only ONE extra parking credential per session
13. RVs must be self-contained. Water hookups are available. No electrical or sewer hook-ups are available. No generators. NO dumping of wastewater of any kind on the ground or in drains. Pump service is available for a nominal charge. Contact the Livestock Office for pumping service purchase at time of reservations.

BREED SHOWS - RV's, TRAILERS, BADGING & OTHER FEES

14. All youth must be under the supervision of an adult at all times.
15. Jockey Quarters will be available on a first come, first serve limited bases. Jockey Quarter fee is \$80.00. Each jockey quarter is limited to the Exhibitor and 2 badged family members who have signed completed waivers on file. Failure to comply could result in loss of Jockey Quarter use for the current and future 22nd DAA livestock shows.
16. Bicycles, Motorcycles, and Electric/Gas Carts will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds.
17. Quiet hours will be observed from 10:00 pm – 6:00 am.
18. All camping fees MUST be received by the entry deadline – Wednesday, May 18, 2024.
19. No dogs are allowed on the Fairgrounds. Guide or Service dogs, dogs in competition or as part of an exhibit, entertainment program or demonstration, and Junior/Youth dog show entries are the only exceptions. Any dog found in the livestock barns will be subject to removal by Fair Security or Animal Control, and the exhibitor subject to disqualification and/or loss of premiums.
20. Livestock Camping Bathrooms - Select bathrooms will be able to be opened in the camping area with the understanding that they can't be assigned to a specific club or chapter. ***Please be aware that the Livestock camping bathrooms are being offered as a privilege, if they are not kept clean, exhibitors and families will lose the ability to use these facilities in the future.***
21. Health & Safety - All campers must adhere to all health and safety policies & practices; these will be distributed to all exhibitors.

Open & Youth Llama Show

All animals will be housed in stable area (horse stalls) during non-Fair hours. During Fair hours animals will be housed in Livestock Barn. Exhibitors may choose to drive in and out daily or stay on grounds. Please designate your plans on entry form.

Processing Fee: \$12.00 per entry

This is an ALSA & ILR-SD Sanctioned Show.

Please submit copy of ILR entry to the San Diego County Fair Livestock Office at time of entry. **Originals must be presented at check-in.**

ALSA fees of \$5.00 per animal entered for all exhibitors, payable to ALSA representative at check-in. Adult Non-ALSA members must pay a \$50.00 fee per farm for showing their animals in an ALSA show. Youth Non-ALSA members must pay a \$15.00 fee to show in ALSA shows. Must present ALSA membership card at check-in.

ILR-SD requires a \$3 fee per animal entered (example: if you have three llamas entered, the fee is \$9). This fee is due at the time of check-in, payable to ILR-SD, only cash or check accepted.

-Rules-

1. This show is sanctioned by ALSA as an official show. Unless other rules are specified, the show will be held under the ALSA rules provided they do not conflict with State or Local Livestock Rules.
2. Animal age based on show date of May 31, 2024.
3. Adult classes: there must be a total of three animals or more in each class before premiums will be paid and high points awarded. Youth classes will be combined if there are fewer than 8 in a division.

DESCRIPTIONS

MASTER PERFORMANCE: For all animals that have completed the requirements for an ALSA Advanced Performance Champion.

ADVANCED PERFORMANCE: Open to all entries that have not achieved advanced performance champion.

NOVICE PERFORMANCE: Open to all entries that have not earned Novice performance champion and/or that have never entered an advanced class.

And/or that have not earned novice performance champion.

OPEN SHOWMANSHIP: Open to any handler. 1st place winner qualifies for ALSA Grand National Competition.

YOUTH: Junior Youth, 8-11 years old; Intermediate Youth, 12-14 years old; Senior Youth, 15-18 years old.

ADULT - Handler - 19 years and older. See ALSA rules.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE)

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations, which they impose, on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns or animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of the Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further consent that any action, which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be, released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

2024 LOCAL RULES

1. Local Rules are subject to any action that may cause revision or curtailment at any time before each competition or judging. Upon submission of online entry and payment if applicable, the exhibitor acknowledges that they have read and understood these rules and all others of the competition in which they enter and are further responsible for viewing, reading and understanding all revisions or curtailments on the San Diego County Fair's website before the competition. Exhibitors may request an additional copy of the most current rules by contacting the entry office.
2. Acceptance of online entries includes permission to use your name, photograph and exhibit for the news media.
3. Incomplete or incorrect entry forms may be returned at the discretion of the management. The management is not responsible for errors on entry forms which may lead to elimination or disqualification of an entry.
4. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain necessary permission to use material that is considered copyrighted in their entries.
5. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her. Exhibitor agrees to indemnify, and hold harmless, the State of California, San Diego County Fair and all officers, agents, and employees thereof from all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses, or liability costs suits or actions of every name, kind and description, brought forth from or on account of, injuries to death of any person including but not limited to workers, and the public, or damage to property resulting from the performance of the exhibitor or entries. Neither party shall request apportionment of liability by a jury.
6. The San Diego County Fair cannot guarantee that all exhibition requirements of an entry can be provided (i.e., electricity, a showcase, a pedestal, special lighting, special location, total space requirements, water source, computer services, or any other special requirements).
7. If the check for the processing fees is refused by the bank, a penalty of **\$35** per check must be paid prior to the judging and/or may result in disqualification. Any or all premiums won will be held until fees and penalties are paid.
8. The management reserves the right to reject any exhibit/entry if it is objectionable in any way, requires an excessive amount of space, or the capacity of the department has been reached. All material used in decorating booths or exhibits must comply with State Fire codes. No entry will be accepted should the exhibitor describe conditions under which he/she will exhibit or the exhibit will be displayed.
9. Registration is required in all departments and some one-day contests. Online entries are accepted until 11:59pm (Pacific Time) on the deadline day for online entry registration. Any entry form received after this time will not be accepted. Only official USPS postmarks will be used to determine eligibility. The Fair is not responsible for any lost or misdirected mail.
10. Entries must be delivered on the date(s) and times specified. Entries will not be accepted before or after the stated delivery date. All accepted exhibits must remain on display and shall not be removed until date specified in the rules. Any exhibit not picked up on specified date becomes the property of the San Diego County Fair and will be disposed of promptly.
11. Substitutions for livestock must be in the same division of the original entry by the original exhibitor.
12. Substitutions must be made at the time of check-in to avoid penalty. Fees may apply for substitutions in excess of two per division.
13. All entrants at exhibits must be neatly attired, wear shoes and conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
14. All premium money will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges in the official judging books and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. The San Diego County Fair assumes no responsibility for special awards offered by clubs, individuals, or sanctioning bodies.
15. All premium and auction checks will be made payable to the exhibitor as listed on the entry form or online entry. Checks will be mailed within 30 days after the close of the Fair to the address shown on the entry form. Auction checks may be held longer if the buyer has not paid. Checks not cashed within 12 months from the date of issue will be forfeited. Replacement checks may be subject to a **\$35** stop payment fee.
16. Requests for refunds must be submitted in writing, in accordance with State Rules. Refunds under **\$15** will not be granted. Processing fees are non-refundable.

2024 LOCAL RULE

17. The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) is required by the Internal Revenue Service to report any premiums paid totaling the amount of **\$600** or more. Exhibitors may be required to submit a W-9 form.
18. All exhibits are entered and shown at the owner's risk. Reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but in no event will the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur or for the actions of third parties. Insurance, if desired, should be obtained by the exhibitor at his/her own expense.
19. The management reserves the right to limit entries, and display thereof, to facilities available and to cancel any division or class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition. Classes may be closed when capacity is reached. No entry will be accepted if the exhibitor describes conditions under which he/she will exhibit.
20. Exhibitor must be living at the time the entry form and/or online entry is submitted.
21. All non-livestock entries must be the creative work of the exhibitor.
22. Any person who violates any Local, State or Department rule or displays unethical conduct will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the District may order.
23. Exhibitors, their immediate family, leaders, advisors and agents thereof, not cooperating with security personnel or any other San Diego County Fair officials in all matters of policy, including but not limited to parking, stall/pen/ space assignments and appearance, judging and/or animal care will have their entries cancelled and will be ordered to remove their exhibit from the grounds immediately and forfeit all awards, premium monies, and sale proceeds. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in being banned from the San Diego County Fair.
24. Management reserves the right to combine or to divide classes in a manner it deems necessary in order to assure adequate competition. In the event of a show change, as a result of this rule, or where classes are established after the close of entries, premiums and awards will be distributed, divided or eliminated in a manner as deemed necessary by San Diego County Fair Management.
25. The American System of Judging will be used in the Adult Divisions and the Danish System of Judging will be used in the Youth Divisions, unless otherwise stated.
26. Youth exhibitors must be **5 years** of age by January 1, 2024, and not older than 17 years on May 31, 2024, unless otherwise stated in Department Information.
27. The 22nd District Agricultural Association management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) assumes no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.
