How to Enter

- 1. Go to https://www.sdfair.com/p/participate/entry and click on the Small Animal icon under the exhibitor's page and follow the instructions. Use a Visa or MasterCard to pay entry fees.
- 2. All entries must be registered online, and entry fees paid by 11:59 pm, May 23, 2025.
 - a. Names, addresses, ear tag, tattoo or permanent marking, birthdate, etc. on every entry form(s) are required by May 30, 2025. Any entry missing all or part of the information required shall result in the disqualification of those entries. The information provided will be used exactly as entered for award recognition and payment of award premiums. Please pay special attention to proper spelling, capitalization, full names of cities/counties, no abbreviations and the correct mailing address.
- 3. This Competition Guide is posted in advance and will be subject to any action that may cause revision or curtailment of the sections, premiums, rules or regulations listed
- 4. Everyone must register as an exhibitor when logging in for the first time in any given year. If you entered last year, you will still enter as a first-time exhibitor.
- 5. Take a moment to look through this Competition Guide to see which competition your entry is eligible to compete in.
- 6. Note that sessions expire after 20 minutes of inactivity, so "save to cart" if you plan on leaving the computer for more than 20 minutes.
- 7. Submission of entry implies acceptance of all rules and conditions as stated in this competition guide. Contact the San Diego County Fair Entry Office with any questions concerning entry policies and procedures.

SMALL ANIMAL SHOW RULES

The Local and State Rules, found on our website www.sdfair.com/entry, apply to this Department. Please read them carefully.

1. **ELIGIBILITY: OPEN DIVISIONS:** Open to exhibitors, 18 years or older, who are residents of the United States and minors who are out-of-state residents.

YOUTH DIVISIONS: Open to youth exhibitors, 9 - 17 years of age, who are residents of California. 4- H or FFA exhibitors are governed by 4-H/FFA eligibility and age rules. Indicate age and 4-H/FFA Club or Chapter on the entry form. **4-H Primary**: All youths 5 - 8 years of age (AGE AS OF DECEMBER 31,2024) are limited to primary classes. See State Rule VII-7 for age requirement explanation.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS PROGRAM (YQCA): Every Junior Market and Junior Breeding Livestock & Small Animal Exhibitor is required to hold a current YQCA Training Certificate. Training can be completed at: YQCA (yqcaprogram.org)

Proof of certification is the submission of a copy of a current YQCA Training Form by each exhibitor. YQCA forms need to be submitted digitally at entry or to the Livestock Office by Friday, May 30, 2025.

2. REGISTRATION DEADLINE: Friday, May 23, 2024, 11:59 pm (PST).

Online registration only. Entries must be submitted online using www.sdfair.com/entry by the deadline. You will receive an email confirmation. Support will not be available after 7:00pm on the entry deadline date. Late entries will not be accepted.

- **3. PROCESSING FEES:** Rabbits, Cavies, Pigeons and Poultry are \$5.00 per entry. Pygmy Goat and Dog are \$10.00 per entry. Showmanship is \$10.00. Processing fees are non-refundable.
- **4. LIMIT OF ENTRIES: There** is no limit of entries, unless otherwise noted. The State Rules specify that husband and wife are considered one exhibitor.
- 5. CHECK-IN & RELEASE: All animals must be checked in with the Supervisor before caging. Only animals properly entered, or for special display purposes, will be permitted in the show. Livestock personnel will check the animal(s) and release form before departure. Release forms will be issued to exhibitors or their authorized agents only. Animals removed without a release will forfeit premiums.
- **6. JUDGING:** American System of judging will be used, unless otherwise noted. The aisles will be closed during judging. People interfering with the judge or judging in any way will have their animals disqualified.
- 7. No person will be permitted to handle animals during the show without the permission of the show officials.
- 8. CLASS PREMIUMS: OPEN & YOUTH DIVISIONS:

1st - \$7.00 2nd - \$6.00 3rd - \$5.00

Classes judged Danish receive no premiums, unless otherwise stated.

Per State Rule IV #6 No exhibitor shall receive more than 2 cash awards in one class.

The following awards are offered to the 5 breeds having the largest number of entries:

Rosettes and an award to the Best of Breed for each of the first 10 breeds (Rabbits, Cavies, Pigeons). Rosettes and an award to the Best Opposite of Breed for each of the first 5 breeds (Rabbits, Cavies, Pigeons).

Best of Show, and Reserve of Show to receive an award determined by Fair Staff.

- **9. HEALTH:** Any animal showing evidence of illness, including mites, lice, and fleas, will be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds. Any disabled animal will be refused and must be removed from the Fairgrounds.
- 10. FEED AND CARE: Fair personnel will feed and water animals with feed provided by the Fair. Exhibitors who do not want the Fair to feed their animal must obtain an "OWNER WILL FEED" sign from the supervisor. Cavy exhibitors must provide a plain water bottle (new in appearance), with wire or spring hanger for each animal entered. If there is no water bottle present at check-in the animal will be sent home. No shelters will be allowed in cages and will be removed by Fair Management, if present.
- **11.** Absolutely no cardboard or paper will be used for partitions. Only partitions issued by the Small Animal
 - Office will be allowed for use.
- **12. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Substitutions will be made ONLY in the same class of original entry. All substitutions must be COMPLETED 24 hours before the show opens. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- **13. SALE OF EXHIBITS:** Exhibitors may not display more than ONE business card affixed to the TOP of cage with a "figure 8" clip. "For Sale" signs are prohibited. Prices MAY NOT be shown anywhere in the showroom. Exhibitors who abuse this policy will lose their opportunity to display their business cards.
- **14. BADGES**: All Breed Show Exhibitors must be badged. All badging will be completed only at the badging trailer by admissions staff. No exceptions. See badging schedule. A \$20.00 fee will be charged for lost/replacement badges.
- **15. UNAUTHORIZED ANIMAL REMOVAL:** Exhibitors found removing animal(s) prior to the Fair's departure schedule without Livestock Office permission shall forfeit all premiums and be excluded from entering future Fairs.
- **16. FOOD AND DRINK:** Food and/ Drink for human consumption is prohibited in the barn area. Consuming food and beverage items may only take place outside of the barns.
- 17. CONTACT INFORMATION: If you have a change of address, phone number or email address, you are required to update this information with the Entry Office so we can contact you regarding awards.
- 18. Exhibitors, their immediate family, leaders, advisors and agents thereof, not cooperating with security personnel or any other San Diego County Fair officials in all matters of policy, including but not limited to parking, stall/pen/space assignments and appearance, judging and/or animal care will have their entries cancelled and will be ordered to remove their exhibit from the grounds immediately and forfeit all awards, premium monies, and sale proceeds. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in being banned from participating at the San Diego County Fair.

RVs, Trailers, Badging and Other Fees

Forms and fees must be submitted with online entries on or before Friday, May 23, 2025.

Requests received after the deadline may not be eligible for accommodation.

Failure to comply with the following rules will result in removal from the Fairgrounds.

- 1. <u>Badges must be purchased through the online entry system.</u> Every exhibitor is *required* to purchase an exhibitor badge which is valid for the entire run of the 2025 San Diego County Fair, no exceptions.
- 2. Each exhibitor may purchase 4 (Four) additional badges for parents/guardians and immediate family members. Badges required beyond this number must be approved by the Agriculture/Livestock Department Staff via written request. Once approved, these additional badges can be purchased through the "Special Approval Badge Division" on Showorks. Badges purchased without approval will not be issued a refund.
- 3. Tents will require a camping space, the fee is \$100.00
- 4. Each reservation must be made online with the exhibitor's livestock entries. Only one space will be available per family. Reservations are limited to exhibitors or parents, leaders, and advisors of exhibitors showing market animals on the dates requested.
- 5. There will be no admission to the camp area prior to designated arrival time.
- 6. Failure to vacate at the designated time will result in vehicles being towed at the owners expense.
- 7. The Livestock Coordinator assigns camp spaces. RVs and trailers must be in assigned space. All camp vehicles must be placed in accordance with Fire Marshal Restrictions.
- 8. Pop-outs may only be extended towards the aisle and on one side of the trailer/RV. All camp vehicles must be approved as overnight stay vehicles and display proper credentials.
- 9. Non-camping vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas only. Each club/chapter may park only one stock trailer in designated dead storage area and display permit issued by the Livestock Office. All others must be removed from the Fairgrounds after delivery of animals. Any vehicle illegally parked is subject to towing.
- 10. If you pay a camp fee for a stock trailer, you will forfeit the fee and be asked to remove the trailer. The exception to this rule is Living Quarters trailers that are used for camping.

- 11. Each exhibitor receives one parking permit per session. ONE additional vehicle permit may be purchased to park in designated areas per family. Spaces may NOT be reserved to park additional vehicles. A parking permit does not guarantee a parking space. Vehicles improperly parked will be towed at owner's expense. Parking permits must be always displayed and affixed to windshield in parked vehicle. No Taping of Permits.
- 12. Extra Parking Credentials does not guarantee a spot for the extra vehicle.
- 13. RVs must be self-contained. Water hookups are available. No electrical or sewer hook-ups are available. No generators. NO dumping of wastewater of any kind on the ground or in drains. Pump service is available for a nominal charge and must be purchased through the online entry portal.
- 14. All youth must always be under the supervision of an adult. A legal guardian or designated adult must be with the minor or minors that will be camping overnight.
- 15. Jockey Quarters will be available on a first come, first serve limited bases. The Jockey Quarter fee is \$80.00. Each jockey quarter is limited to the Exhibitor and 2 badged family members who have signed completed waivers on file. Failure to comply could result in loss of Jockey Quarter use for the current and future 22nd DAA livestock shows.
- 16. Bicycles, Motorcycles, and Electric/Gas Carts will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds.
- 17. Quiet hours will be observed from 10:00 pm 6:00 am.
- 18. All camping fees MUST be received by the entry deadline Friday, May 23, 2025. Any Camping fees or requests received after the closing date of entries will be subject to space available and specific accommodations/requests may not be able to be fulfilled.
- 19. No dogs are allowed on the Fairgrounds. Guide or Service dogs, dogs in competition or as part of an exhibit, entertainment program or demonstration, and Junior/Youth dog show entries are the only exceptions. Any dog found in the livestock barns will be subject to removal by Fair Security or Animal Control, and the exhibitor subject to disqualification and/or loss of premiums.
- 20. Livestock Camping Bathrooms Select bathrooms will be able to be opened in the camping area with the understanding that they can't be assigned to a specific club or chapter. *Please be aware that the Livestock camping bathrooms are being offered as a privilege, if they are not kept clean, exhibitors and families will lose the ability to use these facilities in the future.*
- 21. Health & Safety All campers must adhere to all health and safety policies & practices; these will be distributed to all exhibitors.

SMALL ANIMAL SHOWMANSHIP

Entry Deadline: Wednesday, May 23, 2025, 11:59 pm (PST).

Entry Fee: 10.00 per entry American System of Judging

- 1. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor and must be shown in an individual junior class other than Showmanship. (With the exception of Poultry in 2025). Animals must stay on the grounds until the official checkout.
- 2. Exhibitors entering the Showmanship contest must be 4-H, FFA, Grange members or Independent exhibitors and will be required to wear the official uniform of their youth organization or white pants and white collared shirt for Independent Exhibitors. The preparation for showing must be done by the owner.
- 3. Grange and Independent Exhibitors shall enter with 4-H in Showmanship classes.
- 4. Showmanship is judged on the exhibitor's ability to properly show his or her own animal. Therefore, you may enter only one time with each species you bring to the Fair. Example: If exhibitor enters two rabbits, only one will be shown in a showmanship class. If an exhibitor enters one rabbit and one cavy, he/she may enter each animal in showmanship.
- 5. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time listed in the Small Animal Breeding Show Schedule of Events. Showmanship classes will not be held for exhibitors. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to be on hand and ready to show when called for judging. There will be no reassignment for missing classes.
- 6. Exhibitors will be qualified for master showmanship with the first species with which they win. If they win showmanship in any other species or if they choose not to participate, the second-place showman will be offered the opportunity to compete in master showmanship and will be notified, in advance of their opportunity to participate.

- 1. 4-H/Grange/Independent Junior 9 or 10 years of age as of December 31, 2024
- 2. 4-H/Grange/Independent Intermediate 11, 12 or 13 years of age as of December 31, 2024
- 3. 4-H/Grange/Independent Senior 14 years and older on or before December 31, 2024
- 4. 4-H/Grange/Independent Challenged (not eligible for Master Showmanship)
- 5. FFA Middle School
- 6. FFA Novice High School
- 7. FFA Senior
- 8. FFA Challenged (not eligible for Master Showmanship)

Age/Experience Qualifications

FFA Middle School – must be in certified FFA middle school program.

FFA Small Animal Novice – FFA members who have never exhibited a small animal (Rabbit, Cavy, Poultry, Pygmy Goat, Dog) at any fair prior to the start of the project year.

FFA Senior – FFA Members having prior showmanship experience with any large animal species

Small Animal Master Showmanship- Saturday, July 5th, 11:00 a.m.

The winners of FFA, 4-H/Grange/Ind Junior, 4-H/Grange/Ind Intermediate and 4-H/Grange/Ind Senior Showmanship must compete in this class. Each contestant will be required to show the following:

Poultry (Stuffed Animal Used) Pygmy Goat Rabbit Cavy Dog

Please Note: Market Week Small Animal showmanship winners are also required to compete in this contest. The 4-H Senior and FFA Senior Master Showmanship winners will be eligible to compete in Small Animal Master Showmanship at the California State Fair.

RABBIT SHOW RULES

Entry Deadline: Wednesday, May 23, 2025, 11:59 pm (PST).

This is an official A.R.B.A. Show

- 1. The Junior Breeding Rabbit Show is an American Rabbit Breeders Association sanctioned show; as such all rules of the association will be followed. Eric Stewart, Executive Director; PO Box 400, Knox, PA 16232. The American Rabbit Breeders Association Convention will be held in Indianapolis, IN November 14-19, 2025. ARBA website: www.arba.net. Membership Dues: \$12.00 per yr., 3 yrs. \$30.00. The age of an exhibitor in the breeding rabbit show shall be over 9 years of age and not have reached their 19th birthday on the day of the show. No exceptions except the Market & Showmanship Classes.
- 2. The Junior Rabbit Show will be judged according to the schedule published. Each exhibitor is responsible for bringing his/her rabbit(s) to the judging table and for their removal from the judging area when requested. All carry cages MUST have leak-proof bottoms, and be free from droppings, urine or bedding material from a previous show.
- 3. The Open Rabbit Show is an American Rabbit Breeders Association sanctioned show; as such all rules of the association will be followed. Eric Stewart Executive Director; PO Box 400, Knox, PA 16232. The American Rabbit Breeders Association Convention will be held in Indianapolis, IN November 14-19, 2025. ARBA website: www.arba.net. Membership Dues: \$20.00 per yr., 3 yrs. \$50.00. Combination Husband & Wife: \$30.00 per yr., 3 yrs. \$75.00.
- 4. The Open Rabbit Show will be judged according to the schedule published. Each exhibitor is responsible for bringing his/her rabbit(s) to the judging table and for their removal from the judging area when requested. All carry cages MUST have leak-proof bottoms, and be free from droppings, urine or bedding material from a previous show.
- 5. The Small Animal Show Rules, State, and Local Rules, found in Small Animal information apply to this Department. Please read them carefully.
- 6. Entry Fee: **\$5.00** per entry per class
- 7. Rules, definitions and judging procedures, as prescribed in the latest edition of the Standard of Perfection from the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. shall apply to the San Diego County Fair Rabbit Show, provided they do not conflict with any of the State Rules.
- 8. **JUDGING:** Rabbits that are entered in the wrong class and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibits in the variety.
- 9. A judge may disqualify a rabbit from competition because of temporary or curable defects or viciousness, but the rabbit will be counted as an entry.
- 10. All cage locks must be removed by the exhibitor prior to judging. Failure to do so will prevent the rabbit from being judged.
- 11. All rabbits must be identified by permanent ear markings in the left ear conforming to the information on the entry form. Animals not marked with legible and permanent tattoo will be barred from competition. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same class will be disqualified from competition. Animals must be tattooed prior to delivery. At time of check-in, all rabbits have the correct coop number placed in the rabbit's right ear. Failure to do so will disqualify the rabbit from competition. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have this done before rabbits are cooped.
- 12. Exhibitors, please provide the following information when filling out the entry form. The information will aid the livestock staff in placing all entries in correct classes and speed up your check-in process.
 - a. The exhibitor must name the breed and/or color on the entry form when entering in any A.V. or A.O.V.Division.
 - b. State the variety when entering an A.O.V. Division/Class.

- c. When entering a light or heavy miscellaneous Division/Class, state breed and variety.
- d. NOTE: The Miscellaneous Division of Heavyweight or Lightweight Breeds will apply to all standard breeds as prescribed by the latest edition of the A.R.B.A. Inc. Standard of Perfection. They will be judged as one Division, regardless of the number of entries, breed or variety.
- 13. If an animal is quarantined prior to judging, it will not be allowed on the show table.
- 14. Houses, partitions, toys and signs will not be permitted unless approved by San Diego County Fair Livestock Department Coordinator or Small Animal Coordinator. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will be asked to remove their animals and will forfeit all premiums and awards.
- 15. **UNAUTHORIZED ANIMAL REMOVAL:** Exhibitors found removing animal(s) prior to the Fair's departure schedule without Livestock Office permission shall forfeit all premiums and be excluded from entering future Fairs.

RABBITS – JUNIOR & OPEN

DIVISIONS & CLASSES FOR OPEN & JUNIOR RABBIT SHOWS

All rabbit Exhibitors must enter divisions and classes as outlined on the following pages.

RABBIT CLASSES

- Class 1 Senior Buck Over 8 months of age for heavyweight breeds over 6 months of age for lightweight breeds or having attained minimum senior weight limit of the breed.
- Class 2 Intermediate Buck Between 6 and 8 months of age or having attained maximum junior weight limit of the breed.
- Class 3 Junior Buck Under 6 months of age or not over the maximum junior weight limit of the breed.
- Class 4 Senior Doe Over 8 months of age for heavyweight breeds over 6 months of age for lightweight breeds or having attained minimum senior weight limit of the breed.

Junior exhibitors that choose to compete in Open Classes when those classes are offered in the Junior Show will disqualify themselves for this or any other future San Diego County Fair Junior Show. This is an Open Junior Show, all Junior Exhibitors (4-H, FFA, Grange, and Independent) shall compete in the same classes.
- **4.** The Fair reserves the right to limit entries per exhibitor based on space available.
- 5. ARBA Non-recognized Breeds are NOT eligible.
- **6. JUDGING:** Cavies that are entered in the wrong class and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibits in the variety.
- **7.** All cage locks must be removed by the exhibitor prior to judging. Failure to do so will prevent the cavy from being judged.

Entry Deadline: Wednesday, May 23, 2025, 11:59 pm (PST). Show Date: June 27, 2025, 11:00 am

- 1. The State and Local Rules available online at sdfair.com/entry apply to this Department.
- **2. ELIGIBILITY:** This show is open to 4-H/Grange/FFA organizations located in any California County. All dogs must be Dog Care project animals. Eligible exhibitors must be enrolled in a 4-H/Grange/ FFA Dog Care Project for 2024 -2025. Exhibitors must be 9 years of age by December 31, 2024, and not have passed their 19th birthday by December 31, 2024. Primary exhibitors must be 5 8 years of age by January 1, 2025.
- **3.** Registration Deadline: Must be submitted online only by Friday, May 23, 2025, 11:59pm (Pacific Time). No mail-in, or hand delivery of entry forms.
- **4. PROCESSING FEES:** \$10.00 per class. The showmanship fee is \$10.00. Entry fees may differ from Class to Class and/or Show. Entry fees are nonrefundable. Entries close on May 23, 2025. You will receive a return receipt by entering online.
- 5. JUDGING: San Diego County 4-H Dog Show Rules and AKC rules apply. Highest score from all classes will determine high Junior, Intermediate & Senior participants.
- **6. AWARDS:** Obedience Divisions Ribbons 1st- 4th. Showmanship Pins 1st 4th. Special Awards for High Junior Showman, High Intermediate Showman, High Senior Showman, High Beginning Novice Obedience, High Novice Obedience, High Graduate Novice Obedience, High Open Obedience and High in Trial.
- 7. **DOG RULES:** All dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. No dogs in season are allowed on the Fairgrounds. 4-H dogs must have county I.D. number. Fair management reserves the right to remove any unruly animals.
- **8. ENTRY LIMITS:** One dog per exhibitor in each class. An exhibitor may show another dog in the B divisions. A maximum of two Obedience Class and two Showmanship Classes per handler not showing the same dog in each division.
- **9.** The exhibitor must include the breed, sex, and name of the dog on the entry form. Entry forms without the required information will be returned to the exhibitor.
- **10.** Exhibitors may exhibit in one Obedience and/or one Showmanship Class. The exhibitor may handle another dog in the B division. Dogs (pure or mixed breed) must belong to the exhibitor or the exhibitor's immediate family or have a written lease and must have been trained by the exhibitor only.
- 11. To be eligible to enter any Class, dog and exhibitor must have competed in one or more shows; 4-H or other, belong to a 4-H canine project, or have a canine listed in their FFA record project book.
- **12.** Exhibitors must wear the official 4-H, FFA, or Grange uniform. Independent Juniors must wear business casual or jeans and a long sleeve shirt.
- **13.** All dogs must be free of pests, fleas, and disease.
- **14.** Fair Management reserves the right to limit entries based on the time available for judging.
- 15. This show is held with the approval of the San Diego County Dog Advisory and will be conducted using the San Diego County 4-H Youth Program Dog Show Rules & Regulations. The rules of the American Kennel Club shall be used where there is no 4-H rule to cover a situation & where AKC rules apply. The State of California Fair Rules will apply in all cases. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to be familiar with all Rules & Guidelines. Any incident in violation of rules & guidelines should immediately be reported & shall be handled by the Show Ground Committee on the day of the show. Those found not in compliance are subject to disqualification & will be asked to leave the show grounds. The Show Committee will strive to do all in its power to ensure that matters concerning this show, including entries & computation on score sheets, are correct. We realize, however, that errors can occur. Any discrepancies should be brought to our attention. We request that you review all pertinent information concerning your entry and score while on the Show Grounds. Judge's decision is final. No reviews will be made after the show day!

- **16.** Bitches in the season will not be allowed to compete. Uncontrolled or aggressive dogs will be dismissed.
- 17. No dogs are allowed in the livestock barns except in designated areas. Guide dogs with blind persons are the only exception. Any dog found in the Livestock Barns will be subject to removal by the Fair Security or Animal Control, and the exhibitor will be subject to disqualification and/or loss of premiums.
- 18. Physical assistance in the fitting, grooming, and showing of dogs entered in the Junior Dog Show may only be performed by individuals eligible for the Junior Dog Show. These assistants must further qualify by having been enrolled in a California Elementary, Secondary or approved Home School within the last 18 months. Proof of enrollment must be provided by the school official upon request by the Fair Officials. Individuals who do not qualify for entry in the Junior Dog Show (i.e., Parents, Guardians, Teachers, Advisors, Leaders, other Adults or unqualified minors) may not fit, groom or show these animals.

The intent of this fitting rule is that junior exhibitors are primarily responsible for the fitting, training, grooming and/or showing of the animals they are presenting and showing, without the physical assistance of adults and/ or professionals. Recognizing that some physical assistance is often required, individuals who are eligible to be junior exhibitors in the Junior Dog Show are allowed to physically assist in the fitting, grooming and/or showing of an exhibitor's animal.

Parents, Teachers, Advisors, other Adults, unqualified minors or other individuals not eligible to exhibit in the Junior Dog Show may not provide any physical assistance in the fitting, grooming and/or showing whatsoever; is strictly forbidden, verbal assistance by these above-mentioned individuals is allowed. Violation of this rule may result in disqualification.

- 19. Grooming is to take place in the Grooming Area only. Dogs will be contained in a proper sized animal crate. Water must be supplied at all time. No dog shall be left unattended at any time. Dogs must have shade supplied by umbrella, pop-up or crate cover with air hole allowing air to circulate freely. Dogs will be on leash at all times when out of the crate unless a class rule states they are to be judged off leash.
- 20. No sick dog will be allowed on the grounds. No lame dog will be allowed on the show grounds. Upon entering the fairgrounds owner/exhibitor takes full responsibility that the dog is healthy and free of disease.
- **21.** No abuse of a dog will be allowed on the show grounds, surrounding area, or any area deemed "Fair Property."
- **22.** Vehicles must be off grounds no later than 9:00 a.m.
- **23.** Exhibitor lists, specific time and place of show, credentials and other information regarding the Dog Show will be sent to participants prior to the show day.
- **24.** Dogs will be released at the conclusion of the show & awards presentations.

DOG SHOW CLASSES

Handlers who have won a county medal or have three first places with qualifying scores in Novice must move up to Open Showmanship.

FFA, Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship winners will be expected to compete in Small Animal Master Showmanship, **Sunday**, **July 7**, **11am**.

PRIMARY: Experience with handling dogs in showmanship is required. 4-H members are eligible for this class in the ages of 5-8. No class placements are made at the Primary level; it is a participation only class.

NOVICE: Minimal experience with handling dogs in showmanship is required. Handler moves to next class after three first places with qualifying scores in point shows or after winning a county medal.

OPEN A: Has showed a dog in Novice and won three first places with qualifying scores or a county medal. Handler remains in this class until winning a county medal twice, and then moves to Master Showmanship.

OPEN B: Any handler may show a second dog in this class. Novice, Open A, and Master Showman may compete in this class.

MASTER: Handler moves into this class after winning a county medal twice in the Open A class.

NOVICE A: Handlers show in this class after moving up from Beginning Novice B, until receiving three qualifying scores on first dog. Qualifying scores from Novice A carry over into the next year. Thus, any combination of three qualifying scores will move the exhibitor to Graduate Novice. Second or more years' experience with the dog and handler.

NOVICE B: Class is for handlers who have received three qualifying scores in Novice A on one dog & are handling their next dog. A 4H member who, with their project dog, is actively competing or has earned at least one leg toward an AKC (or other qualified competition venue) Companion Dog (or its equivalent) title, may compete in the Novice classes without first competing in the Beginning Novice Classes.

GRADUATE NOVICE: Dogs may compete in this class after moving up from the lower division classes until the leader feels the member is ready for the next class, which is Open. A qualifying score will be 170 points or better with at least one half of the points in each exercise.

OPEN A and OPEN B: These classes are considered continuing goals. Members who complete Graduate Novice, may show in Open and then Utility. Rules for these classes shall be as specified by the AKC.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE)

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured competition classes. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible people who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibitions in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, on the request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally, It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be approved by a licensed veterinarian.
- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- **6.** The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons

- either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- **9.** The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

2025 LOCAL RULES

- 1. Completion of online entry registration shall be deemed acceptance of all rules. Acceptance includes permission to use your name, photograph, and exhibit for the news media.
- 2. Online registration is required in all departments and for one-day contests. Online entries are accepted until 8:00pm (Pacific Time) on the deadline day for online entry registration, unless otherwise stated.
- 3. Once registered, the description, title, and price may not be changed. Substitutions will not be allowed. Fair Management is not responsible for errors on entry forms which may lead to elimination or disqualification of an entry.
- 4. Processing fees must be paid online at the time of registration. Processing fees are non-refundable.
- 5. Exhibitors must be living at the time the entry form and/or online entry is submitted.
- 6. All non-livestock entries must be the creative work of the exhibitor (whose name appears on the entry registration), be in good taste, and suitable for family viewing. Fair Management reserves the right to disqualify any entry/exhibit it deems objectionable or not in accordance with competition standards.
- 7. If an entry is disqualified after judging is complete, no changes will be made to the status of awards given for other entries.
- 8. Exhibitors are responsible for obtaining necessary permission from models and/or to use material in their entry that is considered copyrighted.
- 9. No entry will be accepted should the exhibitor describe the conditions under which he/she will exhibit, or the exhibit will be displayed.
- 10. Judges are qualified in the medium(s) they are judging. New judges may be chosen each year, and judges may be assigned to different divisions/classes from year to year.
- 11. If a coordinator or judge deems an entry to be in the incorrect category, division, class, etc., he or she may direct the Entry Office to move that entry as appropriate. The Entry Office may combine divisions or classes to create an adequate judging pool.
- 12. Fair Management reserves the right to limit entries, and display thereof, to facilities available and to cancel any division or class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.
- 13. Entries must be delivered on the date(s) and times specified. Entries will not be accepted before or after the stated entry delivery date. All accepted exhibits must remain on display and shall not be removed until the stated entry pick up date. Any exhibit not picked up on the specified date becomes the property of the San Diego County Fair and will be disposed of promptly.
- 14. All exhibits are entered and shown at the owner's risk. Reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but in no event will the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur or for the actions of third parties. Insurance, if desired, should be obtained by the exhibitor at his/her own expense.
- 15. Any person who violates any Local, State, or Department rule or displays unethical conduct will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) may order.

- 16. To ensure reliable award notification, exhibitors are responsible for submitting all address, phone number and email address updates promptly in writing to entry@sdfair.com or Entry Department, 2260 Jimmy Durante Blvd, Del Mar, CA 92014.
- 17. Premium money will be paid per the recorded placings in the official judging books rather than the ribbon attached to the exhibit.
- 18. Donated Award recipients will be selected per the instructions given on the Donated Award Confirmation Form submitted by the donor.
- 19. Premium, donated cash award, and auction checks will be made payable to the exhibitor as listed on the online entry registration. Checks will be mailed within 30 days after the close of the Fair to the address shown on the online entry registration, or as updated by the exhibitor via written notification to the Entry Office. Auction checks may be held longer if the buyer has not paid. Checks not cashed within 6 months from the date of issue will be forfeited. Replacement checks may be subject to a \$35 stop payment fee.
- 20. The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) is required by the Internal Revenue Service to report any premiums paid totaling the amount of \$600 or more. Exhibitors may be required to submit a W-9 form.
- 21. The 22nd District Agricultural Association management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules; the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) assumes no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.
